What does it mean to be on the Teen Board?

Being on the Teen Board is a fantastic way to be more involved in the SLAP'D community through a leadership role. All Teen Board members will have their own profile pages from which they can post for other users to see. Through posting content and interacting on the website, the Teen Board members will help creating a welcoming environment for all users. Of course, with great opportunity comes great responsibility. Because SLAP'D is counting on the Teen Board as contributors, a position on the Teen Board will require time and commitment. All members will be expected to meet deadlines, coordinate with their fellow board members, and interact regularly on the SLAP'D website.

How can you get involved?

What positions are available on the Teen Board?

There are many different ways to get involved on our Teen Board. Whether you like art, writing, or managing social media, there's a place for you! Check out the available Teen Board positions listed below:

-Writer

Writers are in charge of the keeping SLAP'D relevant and updated by contributing regular articles to the website. Have a specific interest you'd like to write about? Check our the following sections that our writers will manage:

- **o What Matters** articles about the bereavement process including topics like moving forward, dealing with friends, coping, and dealing with family.
- **o Interviews** interviews with bereavement professionals, parents, friends, and prominent figures who also lost a parent.
- o Advice Column- advice articles on life and bereavement, as well as answering questions for teens.
- o Blog- run a continuously updated blog as a blogging personality, on any of the above topics.

-Editor

Great at details and love grammar? Apply to be an editor! Acting as copyeditors for the Teen Board, editors will be assigned a section and will proofread all content before it is published on the website. This role requires fact checking skills, grammar/proofreading skills, and the ability to quickly turn around articles.

-Artist

Do you love drawing, making art, or playing around with design? The artist will design visual art and graphics to be featured on the SLAP'D website and social media accounts. This position will also help match art and photography to newly published articles.

-Vlogger

Similar to the writer, the vlogger will create and upload video content to the SLAP'D website and maintain an ongoing channel on a specific topic. This position is perfect for the avid YouTuber or anyone who loves to record! Topics for vlogs include:

- o Interviews
- o Informational videos
- o DIY videos
- o Creative readings and performance videos

-Social Media Coordinator

The Social Media Coordinator will update SLAP'D social media accounts including Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. They will publish regular content such as linking articles from the website, reblogging relevant articles from around the web, and uploading and editing art and photos. The Social Media Coordinator will also help moderate and respond to the SLAP'D interactive forum. This position requires working together with Teen Board writers, artists, and vloggers.
